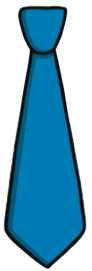
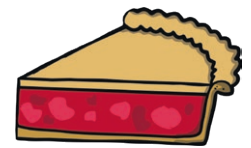

fries

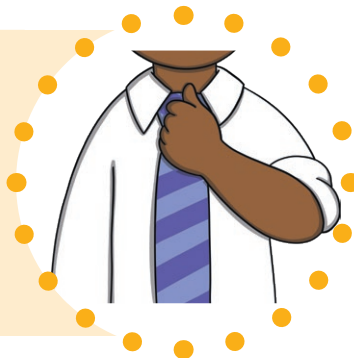

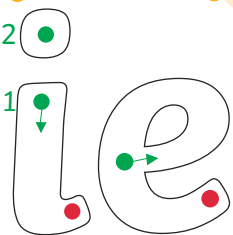

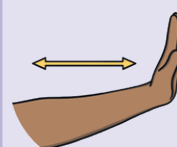
