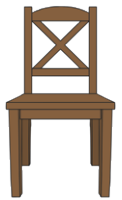


ea

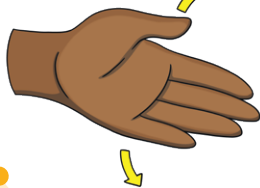
