Level 5

-er

-er can be added to the end of a describing word (adjective). When **-er** is added as a word ending, the word becomes 'more' than it was.

For example:

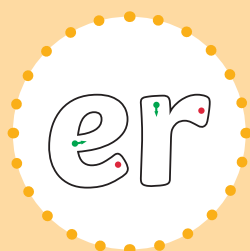
quick becomes **quicker**.

-est

-est can also be added to the end of a describing word. When **-est** is added as a word ending, the word becomes the 'most' it can be.

For example:

quick becomes **quickest**.

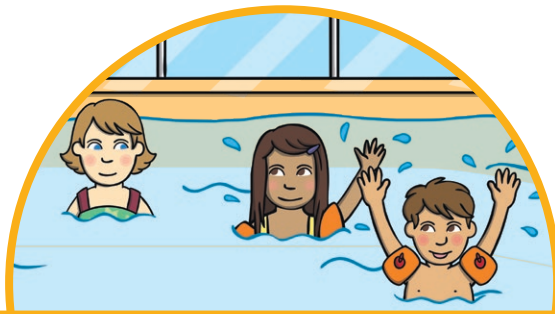
