

This week, we have been learning to read and spell words containing an **unspoken 'e'**.



Level 5

Spelling Patterns

Some words contain a letter **e** at the end that we don't say. It is 'unspoken'. The **unspoken 'e'** always comes at the end of a word, after a consonant, and it doesn't change the vowel sound.

ve

ve can make the /v/ sound when it appears at the end of a word. The **e** is unspoken and doesn't make a sound.

For example:

serve **give** **active**

ce

ce can make the /s/ sound when it appears at the end of a word. The **e** is unspoken and doesn't make a sound.

For example:

voice **dance** **notice**

ze

ze can make the /z/ sound when it appears at the end of a word. The **e** is unspoken and doesn't make a sound.

For example:

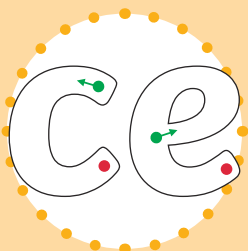
freeze **bronze** **snooze**

se

se can also make the /s/ sound when it appears at the end of a word. The **e** is unspoken and doesn't make a sound.

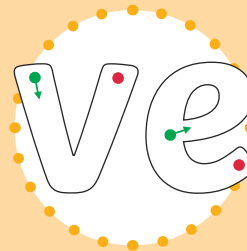

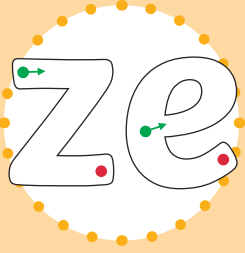

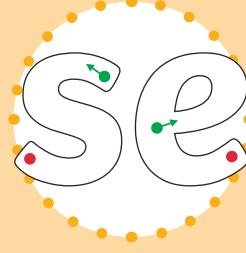
